## Team effort = successful conference

Twin Cities access facilities worked together to help pull off a successful Alliance for Community Media annual conference at the end of July. The conference brought some 600 people from across the country to the Marriott City Center in downtown Minneapolis for four days of workshops, informative panel discussions of everything from state legislation to set design, celebrations of community programming at the Hometown Awards, and networking with community media practitioners from facilities large and small.

**Pam Colby**, the Executive Director of MTN, and I co-chaired the Local Planning Committee, with **Mike Wassenaar**, SPNN's Executive Director and chair of the ACM Board of Directors, as an ex-officio member. Our role was to provide local support, including on-site volunteer coordination, video coverage of sessions, and hospitality.

**Joan Gerten**, former CTV volunteer coordinator, came out of retirement to serve as coordinator of the on-site volunteers, who helped with conference registration, served as session monitors and ticket takers and helped direct people to buses. As we knew she would, Joan did a terrific job of recruiting and directing the volunteer effort, working alongside the ACM staff. Those from CTV who helped out as volunteers included **Teresa Renneke**, **Margaretha "Torchy" Beach**, **Maureen Anderson** along with **Ellen** and **Colin**, **Terri Schultz**, **Lynn Redlinger** and **Brian Brady**.

And what would a conference on community television be without video of the sessions and keynote presentations? **Tim Domke** joined **Judy Skeie-Voss** from the Ramsey-Washington Cable Commission and **Joe Conlon** from Town Square (and truck tech for CTV) to recruit and coordinate a cadre of staff and volunteers to make video recordings of about half of the breakout sessions, the opening and closing ceremonies, and the Saturday keynote luncheon. Again, they did a magnificent job under sometimes challenging circumstances. (Ask Don Swenson about hanging - safely - off the roof of the hotel to string camera cables.)

A full set of the videos will be given to the Alliance for posting on the conference website. In addition, we will keep a set for our own use, including scheduling on our channels. We also want to set up viewing sessions for staff, community producers and volunteers, and Board members of selected sessions so that we can have some discussion of the ideas and issues raised in those sessions. Because

of rapidly changing technology and regulatory challenges, community television/community media must also evolve in order to continue to remain relevant to our constituents. But, while change is often uncomfortable, it also provides us with lots of new opportunities for our communities. We want to engage as many people as possible in that conversation as we move forward at CTV.

CTV actually helped to kick off the conference since it was the first stop on the facilities tours on Wednesday, July 25. Approximately 25 people from facilities around the country stopped by that morning to see our studio, edit suites, master control and production trucks. Although they were all very impressed with our facilities and operation, they were most interested in the DV Drop system that **Dave Schulte** and **Ian Cobb** developed in our evolution to a tapeless facility. Other stops on their tour included SPNN in St. Paul and Town Square Television in Inver Grove Heights.

Then, three CTV producers were recognized at the Hometown Awards on Thursday, July 26. **Jim Radford** and **Phil Holt** won for *Living Room Fragile* in the Original Teleplay category under non-professional, and **John Pearson** won for *The Dentist* in the Children's Programs category under non-professional. In addition, **Keith Flanagan** won an award for *Lifeline* in the Spiritual/ Inspirational category under non-professional, but it was sent in by Town Square TV since he used their truck for that episode.

Bottom line: there were lots of good sessions and good times. Many people commented on how much they were enjoying themselves in Minneapolis and made a point of telling us how friendly everyone was. I think they were very impressed with the amount and professionalism of community television in the Twin Cities, and those who were involved with the conference were pleased that we could show off some of the things that make this a terrific place to live. Good job, everyone!

## Community News Beats

The manner in which information is distributed and obtained is constantly evolving. A new and unique way to consume news is now being offered through CTV by providing local news that is specifically targeted to each city and is designed to give viewers the opportunity to consume news that is extremely “local” in nature.

Video news clips from around the northern suburbs are posted and viewed online. These clips are called *Community News Beats*. The videos are edited together using excerpts taken from CTV’s news program, *North Suburban Beat*. There is a two- to three-minute news piece for each city, making a total of ten. Every city has its very own community-specific news highlights. For instance, Lauderdale’s *Community News Beats* will contain news specifically about Lauderdale. The *Community News Beats* will be constantly updated based on the timeliness of the stories.

These *Community News Beats* provide information in a way that is unique and efficient, and I encourage you to check out your *Community News Beats* to see what is going on in your city. ## Take care of your tapes

All those wonderful things we shoot with our camcorders - and we want to preserve those master tapes as long as possible. Here are some tips on making those tapes work the best for you:

- Always rewind a cassette to the beginning before storing. A tape that is stopped partway through can lose its tautness and develop major playback problems.
- Store tapes in their original cases to protect from dust, humidity and ultraviolet rays. It’s tempting to throw tapes into a box or bag, but it can degrade the quality quickly.
- The people at Panasonic suggest we fast forward and rewind any stored tapes at least once every six months to retain tension, avoid warping and keep layers of tape from sticking together.
- Beware of magnets - they can scramble the signals on your tape. Overlooked items could be toys, magnetic clasps on jewelry and security scanning equipment.
- NEVER leave any video equipment in your car! You’ve heard this one from us before, but it bears repeating. Heat will melt or distort tapes quickly. Cold makes plastic brittle and can snap cassettes or tape. Cameras, tripods and tapes are all vulnerable and need to be protected from weather and theft.

Watch out for all these potential pitfalls and preserve your important footage for posterity.
